Luke 24:13-35

Main Point: Jesus really is risen and you really can hope in Him.

5. What's the connection between the Scriptures, God's plan, and our faith?
6. How did the disciples outlook change after Jesus revealed Himself to them?
7. What practical hope does Jesus' resurrection give you?

Looking Ahead

8. Who do you know who needs the hope of knowing Jesus?
9. How can you rely more on the resurrection hope of Jesus in your daily life?

Pray: Ask God to fill you with resurrection hope for the situations you are facing.

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How to use this guide:

- **Study and discuss the passage**, not necessarily the outline of the sermon
- Don't feel pressure to ask all the questions, use your discernment based on time and needs of the group
- Engage the mind with good doctrine and move to the heart pushing toward application (A key diagnostic for the leader to discern the health of his group is to listen "heart" conversation.)
- Designate a group member to record the spiritual goals of the group, so you can hold each other accountable each meeting.
