

# God's Amazing Compassion: Pt. 2

March 4, 2018

**Passage:** Jonah 4:5-11

**Main Point:** We should joyfully share the Gospel despite our opinions of others.

## Case Study:

Your city is debating whether or not it should be legal to display the 10 Commandments in the classrooms of public schools. How can you use this opportunity to spread the Gospel, regardless of the outcome?

## **The Word:**

1. Why was Jonah angry in chapter 4? When did Jonah's frustration begin?
2. Why did God command the fish to spit Jonah out?
3. What does God expose about the Ninevites (v. 10-11)?

## **The World:**

1. What groups of people in Hancock County would you feel uncomfortable sharing the Gospel with?
2. Has there ever been a time in your life where you failed to obey God? What could you have avoided, had you been obedient?
3. Are there people in Hancock County like the sailors in Jonah's story? How can they see God working in your life?

## **The Application:**

1. How has this study on Jonah changed the way you live?
2. Did you have any opportunities to share the Gospel this week? Share your experience with the group.
3. Share your testimonies and explain how God has shown His colossal compassion to you. (Leaders Note: Consider asking your group who would like to share their testimony this week. One per week is recommended.)

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## How to use this guide:

- **Study and discuss the passage**, not necessarily the outline of the sermon
- Don't feel pressure to ask all the questions, use your discernment based on time and needs of the group
- Engage the mind with good doctrine and move to the heart pushing toward application (A Key diagnostic for the leader to discern the health of his group is to listen "heart" conversation.)
